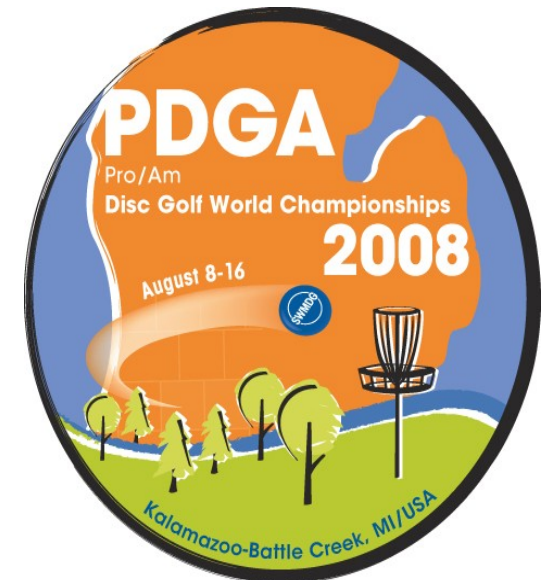

COURSES

CHALLENGING, UNIQUE, & ENJOYABLE

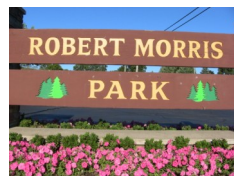


Oshtemo – Nice wooded course with primarily open fairways. Accurate distance is essential from the long tees. Two elevated baskets highlight the slightly varying terrain.

Kimball Pines – Championship caliber course with an excellent variety of holes, demanding most of the shots in your bag. Old pines can be found on most fairways. The course is well designed offering a challenge on each hole.

Timber Ridge – World class course integrated into a ski area. Lots of elevation changes with exhilarating down hill shots and a mix of technical and distance shots. Everyone will have the chance to play this massive course.

Robert Morris – A pristine park overlooking a lake. The course will challenge all players with an excellent mix of technical and controlled distance shots. It has good elevation changes with playable fairways and great pin placements.



Begg Park – A beautiful park with mostly open holes and a stream that cuts through the center. A few shorter holes through a wooded area will challenge most players. Some elevations changes come into play on most holes.



Cold Brook – An 'old school' course that has many holes that are as easy to birdie as bogie. Very nice flow through a mix of open and challenging holes. Beautifully manicured and landscaped. Two signature holes will challenge every disc golfer for par.

Albion Permanent - Expected to be installed this fall, this course will be a short technical course. The front 9 will be among mature oak trees on a hilly terrain. The back nine will be flatter and less trees, but will include many water hazards.



Albion Temporary - On Albion College's Equestrian Club, this course will be long and open on rolling hills. Big tree lines and a pond will add difficulty. It should be playable next summer shortly before the worlds.

Meyer Broadway – features rolling hills and woods with both distance and accuracy required to score well. Playing the fairway is key on many holes as the rough is very unforgiving, and basket placements set to punish approach shots gone awry.

Three Rivers Temp – like Meyer Broadway, it features rolling fairways and woods with very deep rough to punish errant drives. Distance will be at a premium as this course takes advantage of every bit of elevation allowed.
